Important Updates/Reminders – Carnival Entry Process



- New Event Carnival Entry Program for this season
- No late entries will be accepted
- When entering athletes only enter the event that they are going to compete in
- Clubs must enter the names of their Officials via the online spreadsheet by close of entries
- A club cannot add or swap names on the day of the carnival (e.g. athletes that have entered for those that have not)

Important Updates/Reminders – Officials Rosters



- All Officials must be signed on with the Area Referee in their allocated area no later than 7.45am
- Officials carnival roles will be determined by the Area Referee
- LSV reserves the right to move Water Safety Personnel and Officials where the demand is needed
- Club official ratios are based on the number of competitors entered – clubs should be mindful that official requirements will not change if competitor numbers are lowered

****Note:** It is a requirement for Clubs who fall within the 1-4 competitor's category to work with LSV to develop their pool of officials & be sustainable for growth in the future.

Any club new to the Surf Sport competition may be exempt from the ratios for the first 3 carnivals. It is the clubs obligation to work with LSV to develop accredited officials and meet their ratios for the remainder of the competition season.



Carnival Rosters

Water Safety/Powercraft

- Powercraft personnel are crucial to setting up the courses and providing water safety for carnivals
- Clubs may swap shifts with other clubs, but must notify LSV of the swap by close of entries for that carnival by email to sport@lsv.com.au
- Clubs can use Team App to organise shifts with other clubs
- Paid Lifeguards – if you cannot fill shifts this is an option
- Please ensure you send appropriate personnel with relevant awards
- Watersafety/Powercraft rosters can be found in the Team Managers and Officials Handbook

Important Updates/Reminders – Set up & Pack Up



- ALL clubs attending carnivals are required to supply 1 member for set up and pack up
- Members are required to sign on with LSV Staff at the LSV Administration tent before commencing their shift and sign off after their shift

Important Updates/Reminders – Club Penalties



- Clubs who fail to meet their officials, powercraft or set up/pack up requirements will be penalised accordingly
- In the event that a Club fails to meet their requirements for a carnival, the Team Manager will be asked to speak with the Carnival Disciplinary Committee (CDC)
- Upon review by the CDC, they may impose a sanction at the time, or refer the matter to the Aquatic Sport Executive

Important Updates/Reminders – Local Rules



Code of Conduct:

- Clubs are reminded that they are responsible for the conduct and behaviour of all members of their team, including their supporters and parents
- Any unbecoming behaviour emanating from members or supporters may be subject to action by a Competition Disciplinary Committee as per appropriate LSV processes



Important Updates – Local Rules

Youth Competition

This season the U14s will participate at Youth/Senior carnivals only. Team events will be run as per Aussies i.e. U14/15 will be combined.

U13s are not permitted to compete at Youth/Senior Carnivals.

Triple Dipping Reminder

Competitors shall be limited to two team ages only - U17, U19, U21, U23, Open - their own age group plus one older age group or only two older age groups.

Youth Policy

Victorian Youth/Senior Championships

- All Youth competitors are eligible to form Combined Teams if they have insufficient numbers entered in their area to form their own club team.
- If a club can form a club team, then additional competitors in that age group cannot go into Combined Club Teams.
- All teams must be pre-entered to all auditing. No on-day combined club teams allowed
- Clubs can pre-register a combined team of their choosing by notifying LSV via email at sport@lsv.com.au

U17 & Up Policy (Water Beach)

Victorian Youth/Senior Championships

- The top 10 clubs on the Combined Club Teams Exclusion Score from the previous year's state champs are unable to form composites. All other clubs can.
- The Combined Club Teams' Exclusion Score is the total score from the previous year's state champs, minus points earned in surf boat events, first aid, patrol and champion lifesaver events.
- Regardless of the club's placing in the previous year, if a club can form a club team for a particular event, then any additional competitors cannot go into other Combined Club Teams.

Combined Teams



Surfboats

- Entries in the Lifesaver Relay will comply with the Combined Club Teams rules for the Board/Ski/Swim sections of the competition
- Clubs placing in the top three on the boat section point score from the previous year's championships are excluded from making Surf Boat Composite Crews.
- Where a crew from a 'top three club' has an S2 qualified sweep, and the SHR is moves above 13, and an S3 sweep from that club is not available, an S3 sweep from another club not competing in that grade may be substituted. Note that the crew must start the titles with a sweep from their club. Note the substitute sweep must be proficient and entered.

The following clubs may not form CCT's in the 2020 Championship events

- Victorian Championships and VSRL Open – Torquay, Lorne and St Kilda
- Victorian Masters Championships – Lorne, Port Fairy and Jan Juc

Restricted Events – First Aid & Patrol Competition

- Any Combined Club Teams are allowed to enter and can win medals.
- The highest placed full club team at state champs is given the entry spot to Aussies.



Combined Teams

The following clubs will be unable to create CCT's for the 2020 Victorian Senior Lifesaving Championships U17 – Open team events (excluding First Aid, Patrol Competition and Surf Boats):

Increase in Carnival Fees

- Youth/Senior \$30.00
- Victorian Lifesaving Championships (Youth/Senior, Masters, Endurance) \$46.00

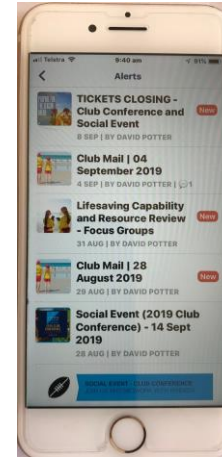
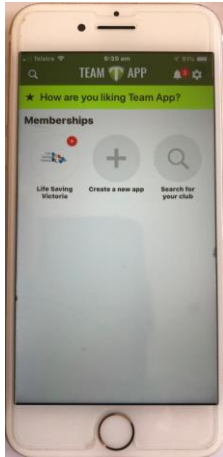
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Life Saving Victoria Team App
