Entry Fees

Entry fees for the 2020 Victorian Lifesaving Championships are \$46.00 per competitor. As this event is part of the Victorian Lifesaving Championships any athlete entered into the Youth Senior Championships at Lorne SLSC and/or Victorian Masters Championships at Lorne will **not** be charged for both events.

Proficiency & Patrol Hour Requirements

The details of these requirements are set out in the [SLSA 5.04 Competition Eligibility Guidelines](#).

The entry system will show clubs who are eligible/ineligible for competing at this Championship event. No athletes are permitted to be entered if they are ineligible

Team Managers must also review their clubs 'Full Competitor List - Patrol Hours' report via the reports section of the Entry System. This sheet must be printed and signed by each Team Manager, and submitted to LSV by the close of entries, with explanations outlining why someone has been entered if they come up as ineligible. Clubs entering ineligible competitors may face disciplinary action.

First Aid Events

1. Teams must have been trained to compete and completed a practice scenario before they compete in this years' Championships. It will be at the discretion of the Referee to accept teams or not on the night. **It is not an event that you simply turn up to and have a go!**
2. For training resources [click here](#) for judging sheets if you have not already got some examples.
3. Any club with two teams or more on each night (combined ages) must bring a patient as part of their team.
4. Each team must provide **1 fully equipped First Aid Kit** (Refer to Competition Manual – Appendix First Aid List). Blankets, bum bags & splints may be shared.
5. Each Club must supply at least **1 TRAINEE JUDGE** as a minimum that holds a First Aid Certificate.

Official Requirements

All clubs that enter a competitor for the Lifesaver Event Championships will be required to provide one (1) Official, plus one (1) Actor for any team competing in the scenario. Please enter these online via the Officials [Registration Spreadsheet](#).

Champions Lifesaver

The three sections that comprise the Champion Lifesaver event and allocated maximum points are:

Competition Events – 40 points

- Surf Race
- Board Race
- Beach Sprint
- Rescue Tube Race

Questionnaire – 40 points

- 40 Multiple Choice questions derived from the current SLSA Training Manual

Resuscitation – 40 points

Champion Patrol

The patrol competition is divided into 4 basic sections:

Physical Skills – 20 points

- Surf teams
- Board Tube rescue relay race

Theory – 20 points

- 20 multiple choice questions derived from the current SLSA training manual

Resuscitation – 20 points

Scenario Task – 40 points

First Aid Competition

All teams are required to have available a First Aid Kit for the competition. Refer to First Aid requirements from the [36th Surf Sports Manual](#). Clubs sharing First Aid Kits between their competition teams are required to re-stock the first aid kit immediately after each scenario prior to it being given to their other teams in isolation.

General Information

Medals will be awarded to 1st, 2nd & 3rd place in each division.

Championship points gained in the 2020 Victorian Lifesaver Event Championships contribute to the point score for the 2020 Victorian Lifesaving Championships.
