Definitions / Explanations

Facility Location and Contact Details

- **GPS Location:** Global positioning system enables the exact location of a facility to be determined, using a longitude and latitude measure. Can usually be found using a smart phone or google maps.

Facility Features

- **Lap pool:** Lap lane pools are those pools specifically designed for lap lane swimming. They are usually 25m or 50m in length with floor and wall marking in place to provide direction to swimmers.
- **Leisure pool:** Leisure pools come in many shapes, sizes and depth. They may be referred to as a Play pool, Toddler pool, Learn to swim pool, Kids pool or Fun pool. They are pools intended for leisure, lesson or play activities as opposed to lap lane swimming or events / competition.
- **Spa pool:** A water-retaining system with filtration, sanitizing, heating and additional equipment for creating turbulent water and a skimmer system, not intended to be used for swimming. A Spa pool should meet the provisions set out in AS2610.1 (2007) - Spa Pools: Public Spas.
- **Hydrotherapy pool:** A pool containing heated water, especially designed to meet the therapeutic needs of persons of any age with impairment due to illness, injury, disease, intellectual deficiency, congenital abnormality, or any change in normal mobility. A Hydrotherapy pool should meet the provisions set out in AS3979 (2006) - Hydrotherapy Pools.
- **Wave pool:** Fan shaped pools varying in surface area and depth. Waves are generated at one end by mechanical paddles, water pressure or air pressure and vary in frequency, amplitude, pattern and cycle.
- **Rapid / lazy river:** Level channels of moving water created by pumping water at predetermined flow rates. Lazy rivers have water moving ≤ 1.5 m per second. Rapid rivers have water moving at ≥ 1.5 m per second.
- **Diving facilities:** Springboard or rigid platform facilities intended for recreational, training or competition diving purposes. Facilities should meet the provisions set out in the FINA Handbook.
- **Waterslide / flume:** A shaped channel containing flowing water along which patrons are transported with an incline terminating in a run-out or pool, under the influence of gravity. A Waterslide / flume should meet the provisions set out in AS3533.1 (2009) - Amusement Rides and Devices.
- **Movable floor:** A moveable floor is a structure within a pool which can be raised, lowered and / or angled to increase / decrease water depth and subsequently increase the usage options of a pool.

Facility Ownership and Management Details

- **Facility Management Organisation:** The management organisation is the agency managing the facility on a day to day basis. The management and owner organisation may be the same.
- **Facility Owner Organisation:** The owner organisation is the building owner. This may be an organisation, private entity or individual.
- **Pool Classification:** Pool classifications are set out in the Safer Public Pools - Code of Practice. The system enables publicly accessible pools to be further classified by their ownership, operation and usage, in a manner consistent with the RLSSA National Aquatic Facility Classification System.
- **Annual attendance / patronage:** The number of patronage making use of the facility on an annual basis.
